The issue:

In 2018, St. Louis City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF) had been underfunded for at least 5 years.

What's the AHTF?

The Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF) is administered by the City's Affordable Housing Commission (AHC) and funded by the City's local Use Tax.

It awards loans and grants to develop affordable housing projects and provide housing-related services, including accessibility modifications, home repair, and support for the homeless.

What is the Affordable Housing Trust Fund?

- The Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF) is funded annually by the Use Tax and dedicated to affordable housing and related services.
- The AHTF awards grants and loans for affordable housing projects, home repair, homeless services, and other supportive services.


AHTF Housing Projects by Ward


AHTF-Funded For-Sale Units

Since 2003, the AHTF has funded 1,583 new rental units and 184 homes for sale.

Why the AHTF is important

It catalyzes investment that might not flow otherwise.

- Every \$1 the AHTF spends on home construction and major rehab is matched by \$17 in public and private funds.
- Most loans to developers and home buyers are repayable.
- Expanding AHTF dollars will make St. Louis more competitive for outside funds.

It builds strong communities.

- The AHTF addresses vacancy by rehabilitating properties and putting them to productive use for people who need housing.
- Underutilized, unsafe, and/or substandard buildings are being replaced with safe, attractive, accessible, energy efficient, and affordable homes.

It works to solve homelessness.

- A person earning minimum wage could spend up to 67% of their income on rent, more than twice what the federal government defines as affordable.¹



- The AHTF helps put housing in reach for our most vulnerable.

Why does it matter if it's underfunded?

The AHTF is a critical resource for providing **support to St. Louis' most vulnerable residents** and creating a **more inclusive community**.

- All AHTF funds awarded **must benefit families and individuals with incomes at or below 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI)**.
- **40% of funds awarded must benefit those earning 20% or less than the area AMI.**

The solution:

Convene a coalition of "surprising stakeholders" who all care about affordable housing to advocate together.

The Affordable Housing Trust Fund Coalition

Result #1

St. Louis City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund was fully funded in FY 2019 and has grown since then.



Result #2

St. Louis County established an Affordable Housing Trust Fund in late 2019.



The issue:


We know that we don't have enough affordable housing resources currently available in St. Louis, but in recent years our region hasn't had the tools it's needed to accurately grasp the full scope of that need.

The solution:

The St. Louis Affordable Housing Report Card was created as an accessible, easy-to-use tool for community organizations, housing advocates, regional decision-makers, and residents in St. Louis City and County who want to see growth in and more equitable use of affordable housing resources.
